

# Le Petit Manoir

A haven of peace and culinary delights

Le Petit Manoir, built in 1764 and classed as a historic site, has been transformed into a delightful and welcoming hotel following a hugely successful renovation project undertaken by owners, Groupe BOAS. It has quickly become known for its warm welcome and delicious food and its ideal location between Geneva and Lausanne. Today the hotel is under the management of the charming Evelyn Perret.

The style of Le Petit Manoir transports guests to the elegance of a bygone era, thanks to its antiques, and rich furnishings that are subtly mixed in with modern fabrics. The history of the building, formerly called 'Villa Berlin' is



as much a feature of this hotel as the demands of modern living and the levels of comfort of today. By July 2013, the 11 luxury rooms will be complemented by a new extension which will house 14 rooms with lake views plus a wellness centre in the heart of the ornamental garden. Le Petit Manoir is an idea getaway as well as a gourmet destination, thanks to the chef, Julian Retler whose signature cuisine is one of authenticity and sophistication. His technical mastery and his creativity won him the title of 'Discovery of 2012' by Gault & Millau who awarded him a 14/20 rating in 2013, while the Michelin guide this year

awarded him a Michelin star. Rock lobster, rhubarb chutney and peanut sauce, fillet of beef, broad bean and spring vegetable mousse, sautéed langoustine and goats' cheese madeleines are just a few examples from the varied and delicious dishes on the menu at the gastronomic restaurant of le Petit Manoir. For groups of 8 or more, the chef is happy to create a personalised menu for your guests.

A private room on the top floor of the building that seats 12 provides a discreet and relaxed dining venue under an ancient timbered roof. With its location close to the lakeside, le Petit Manoir offers a wonderful place for watersports enthusiasts as well as



for wine-lovers thanks to the hotel's extensive wine cellars and the surrounding vineyards of Morges. It's the perfect spot for a 'gourmet escape' which costs only 520CHF for two people including one night with breakfast and a surprise dinner of 5 courses with wine.



Le Petit Manoir is a member of the Group BOAS which currently numbers 6 hotels and will soon expand to include 11 establishments, offering a range of different packages suitable for business clients, families, holidays and winter sports. Indeed, next December in Haute Nendaz, the Hotel Nendaz 4 Vallées (4-star) will open with a sumptuous spa laid out over 2200 square metres.
